



French horn player Master Sergeant Mark Questad joined "The President's Own" United States Marine Band in July 1992. Master Sgt. Questad began his musical instruction at age 12 with Howard T. Howard. After graduating from Ridge High School in Basking Ridge, N.J., he attended The Juilliard School of Music in New York. He holds a bachelor of music degree from Indiana University in Bloomington in 1982 where he studied with Robert Elworthy, Philip Farkas, and Michael Hatfield. Prior to joining "The President's Own," Master Sgt. Questad was a member of the Evansville Philharmonic in Indiana, the Owensboro Symphony in Kentucky, and Top Brass. He also has performed with the Manhattan Chamber Orchestra, the New Philharmonic of New Jersey in Morristown, the Group Opera of New York, the American Arts Ensemble, and the West End Chamber Players. In addition, he has made commercial and soundtrack recordings.



Clarinetist Master Gunnery Sgt. Charles Willett retired on March 16, 2018, after serving 28 years in the Marine Band. Master Gunnery Sgt. Willett of Alton, Ill., joined "The President's Own" United States Marine Band in May 1989. He began his musical instruction at age 12. Upon graduating from Alton Senior High School in 1979, he attended Southern Illinois University in Edwardsville, Ill., where he earned bachelor's (1983) and master's (1984) degrees in music performance. While at Southern Illinois University, he studied clarinet with George Mellott. He earned a Premier Prix in clarinet from the Conservatoire d'Orléans in France where he studied with Michel Arrignon. In 1996 he completed his doctorate degree in clarinet performance at Florida State University in Tallahassee where he studied with Frank Kowalsky. Prior to joining "The President's Own," Master Gunnery Sgt. Willett performed with the Columbus Symphony in Georgia and the Tallahassee Symphony in Florida.

IN MEMORIAM

Former clarinet player Master Gunnery Sgt. David Knighton of Bennington, Vt., passed away on April 26, 2018. Knighton served in the Marine Band from 1962–85. Prior to joining the Marine Band, he served for seven years in the Army Field Band.
