Kate Reid, guest vocalist

Jazz vocalist and pianist Kate Reid regularly appears as a duo and with her trio and quartet at jazz venues in the Los Angeles and Miami areas. She can be heard performing with Miami pianists Martin Bejerano and Tal Cohen, guitarist John Hart, and trumpet player John Daversa and his Progressive Big Band. Reid has collaborated with many of the great jazz musicians in southern California, including guitarists Bruce Forman, Ron Escheté, and Larry Koonse and drummers Roy McCurdy and Jamey Tate. Reid's latest CD, *The Heart Already Knows*, was produced by Peter Eldridge and featured pianists Fred Hersch and Taylor Eigsti and guitarists Larry Koonse, Romero Lubambo, and Paul Meyers. The album includes music from the Great American Songbook and the contemporary idiom. Additionally, Reid has worked with many noted artists, including John Clayton, Robin Eubanks, Jon Hendricks, Grady Tate, Mercer Ellington, Don Shelton, Mark Murphy, and the Duke Ellington Orchestra.

Reid is a studio and session singer in Los Angeles. Her film credits include *Planes, Star Trek Into Darkness, Oz the Great and Powerful, Epic*, and *Men In Black 3*, featuring the music of composers Danny Elfman, Michael Giacchino, John Powell, and Joel McNeely. Reid has also lent her voice to network television series; commercial spots for Ace Hardware, T-Mobile, and Suntory Whisky; and backing vocals for artists such as Muse, X Japan, and Josh Groban. Reid co-authored the *GLEE Vocal Method Songbook* for Hal Leonard Publishing with producer and author Andy Waterman of Umbrella Media.

Reid is in demand as a guest artist, conductor, clinician, and adjudicator at jazz and choral festivals through the United States and Canada, including the Banff Centre Vocal Program and the Alberta Choral Festival, in Alberta, Canada; the Ontario Vocal Festival in Canada; the Reno Jazz Festival in Nevada; Eastern Washington University Jazz Festival in Cheney, Washington; and vocal jazz festivals at Cuesta College, MiraCosta College, and Fullerton College in southern California. Reid is an associate professor of jazz voice in the Department of Studio Music and Jazz and is the director of jazz vocal performance at the University of Miami's Frost School of Music. Reid earned a bachelor's degree in jazz studies from Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo, and master's and doctoral degrees in jazz vocal performance from the University of Miami in Florida.
